

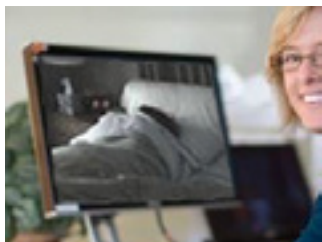

Being able to see each other makes all the difference in the world

In Gothenburg, patients quality of life has increased with the use of the Joice TV Phone.

The city of Gothenburg has also installed **Night Peace** - a camera that works in complete darkness.



Night Peace is connected with the agreement of service users, and allows for continuous monitoring via cell phones or computers

Responsible for this is Annika Ljungh, who thinks Night Peace is the future: *"With Night Peace, you can free up locked resources and provide increased security and safety to these patients, allowing more time for emergency visits."*

Users are equipped with Joice in the district Älvsborg in Gothenburg. Anette Hansson, Director of Älvsborg's elderly says: *"The aim of the project is to increase the security of care takers and increase communication and to reduce the costs of false alarms by replacing certain physical visits with virtual visits."* As a growing number of older people choose to live at home longer,

the aim with the TV Phone is to increase the quality of life.

The aim is for care takers to have quicker and better communication with others such as ambulance services, nurses, family and friends.

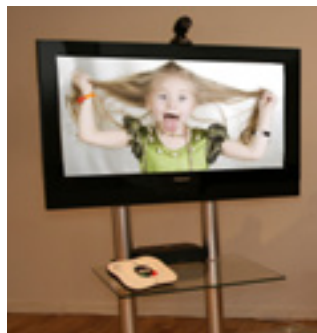
"New venues and networks are important to creating a meaningful existence even when health and impairment decreases," says Anette Hansson.

One participant is almost blind but is capable of handling the remote control to the TV Phone which has only five buttons.

myJoyce CARE developed the TV Phone in order to simplify communication for those living in care homes.



The TV Phone is mounted on a tripod, which can be placed in a common TV room or moved around in the premises as needed

As one gets more frequent contacts with friends and family, the social and mental well-being increases.

The TV Phone is cost effective and requires no technical knowledge or maintenance from staff

Technical Development

Night Peace has been developed so that an alarm can be received as pictures to the care taker's cell phone. The system monitors and records all events from the time the alarm went, to the present. In this way - the staff have more knowledge about what action to take.

Mobile Check is another service that simplifies communication and planning for health care providers in the field. The group has functioning and positioning. Now there are new reporting capabilities so that you can track time spent per activity and users to streamline resource planning.
